

Nueva Vida Haven

(Emergency Shelter) The only nightly drop-in, emergency shelter for women & children in San Diego County. Open 365 days a year for up to 60 clients nightly, women & families are sheltered for 30 days at a time, receiving essential services and support.



Transitional Housing

A 12 month, transitional housing program for single men, women and women with children that addresses their physical, emotional, and spiritual needs; with a focus on developing skills to be self-sufficient and successful.



Over the past 12 months our Rescue Mission has:

Sheltered over 400 men, women & children each night, totalling 156,950 nights of compassionate care



Men's Center

The 12-month state-licensed residential rehabilitation program, provides the tools, training and spiritual foundation for men to transform their lives.



Recuperative Care Unit

RCU provides critical care to those experiencing homelessness who need continued time to heal after being released from the hospital.



Provided 397,639 meals, more than 1,089 each day

Haven of Hope

(Women and Children's Center) This 12-month residential program for women and women with children helps get families back on their feet, kids back in school and hope back in their lives.



Haven of Hope Preschool

Our licensed Preschool serves children experiencing homelessness ages 2-5, where they can heal, begin healthy development, grow a love for learning, and begin their relationship with lesus.



Cared for 2,175 women & children, providing safety from the streets in our emergency shelter



Spiritual Training

Our Spiritual Training program provides Devotions, Chapel, Pastoral Care, and One-on-One Discipleship so that our clients are supported as they grow in their faith and build long-lasting, healthy relationships.



Job Training

This 12 month training program will allow clients to develop skills, gain in-classroom certifications, receive internships with local businesses and find stable employment.



Assisted 171 people by providing critical care and case management through our Recuperative Care Unit

Therapeutic Services

We offer a team of Case Managers and Therapists who offer support, care, and clinically sound services to individuals, families, and children as part of our holistic approach to care.



Partners for Hunger Relief

We collect millions of pounds of surplus food each year to feed the clients we care for and to distribute to other local non-profits, effectively providing hunger relief in and beyond our walls.
