
# OUR SHARED MISSION

### OVER 10,000 HOMELESS LIVING IN SAN DIEGO

San Diego has the 5th largest homeless population in the country with over 10,000 individuals living on the streets. People accessing homeless services annually now pushes 20,000.

We are committed to a regional approach to reduce homelessness with the addition of three 30-day Lighthouse Shelters and our 12-month rehabilitation program, Mission Academy.
